What do you enjoy most about Student Life in DkIT:

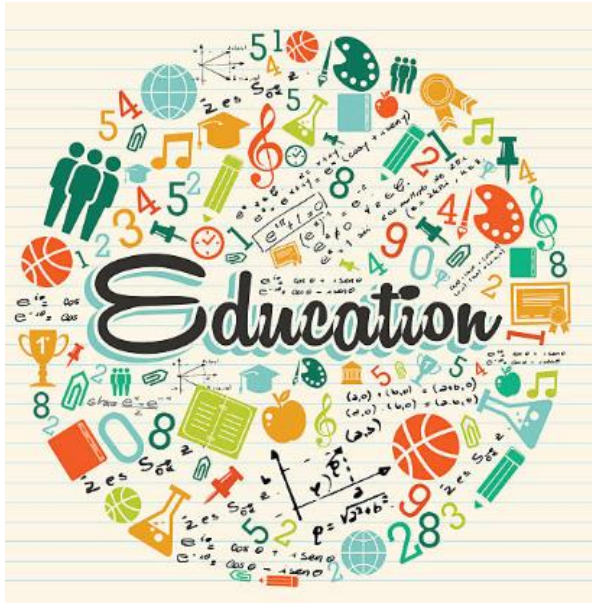

After graduation, my goal is to take all the skill and knowledge I've gained in game

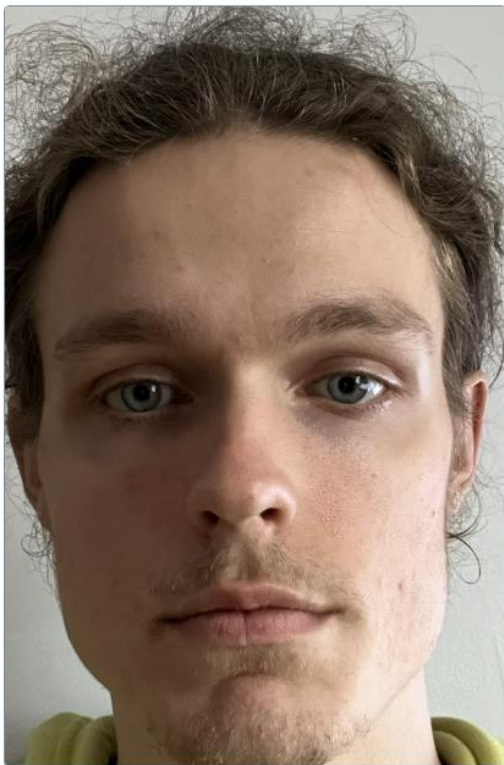

What are your plans for the future when you have completed your programme?

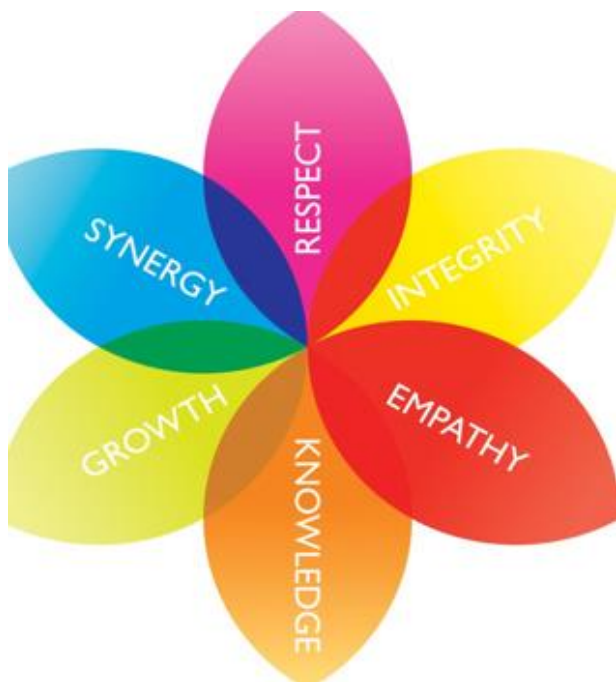
