G.229.4.2 President's Report

1. Health & Safety Update

The ISMC noted that no significant Health and Safety concerns in relation to the North Block have been reported through the FASCs. The North Block, however, still requires significant investment and the President referred to a letter from Mr Richard Bruton, sent to Mr Peter Fitzpatrick in response to requests for funding. In his letter the Minister made no funding commitments.

2. Strategic Developments: DkIT Draft Mission-based Performance Compact

Following the outcome of the strategic dialogue cycle 2 process with the HEA, Dundalk Institute of Technology submitted its revised Mission-based Performance Compact in March 2016. It has been confirmed by the HEA that at its meeting of 23rd May 2016, the HEA Board was satisfied that the progress made by DkIT was sufficient to warrant a release of the 2% performance funding which had earlier been reserved. The Cycle 3 Report to 2015 is due by 17.30pm on Friday 17th June 2016. Printed copies of the submission were distributed to the Board and the Vice President of Strategic Planning, Communications & Development was congratulated for the work involved in preparing the submission.

4. OECD and HEInnovate – Embedding Entrepreneurship

Dundalk Institute of Technology (DkIT) has been identified as a leading exemplar for embedding entrepreneurship in higher education by the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD).

5. Lifelong Learning Centre

The following outlines the final part-time student enrolments for 2015/16, categorised as follows:

- 1. DkIT certified enrolments = 223 (up 30% y-o-y)
- 2. Professional body enrolments = 60 (up 29% y-o-y)
- 3. Springboard enrolments = 189 (up 130% y-o-y)
- 4. Uncertified enrolments = 448 (down 20% y-o-y)

There are 30 new accredited part-time courses on offer for 2016/2017.

7. DkIT lecturer wins prestigious Jennifer Burke Award

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DkIT lecturer in the School of Business and Humanities, Johdi Quinn has been awarded the Jennifer Burke Award for Innovation in Teaching and Learning in recognition of her work in developing language and intercultural learning for her students using Skype exchanges.

8. DkIT Student Wins IVNA Veterinary Nurse Student of the Year 2016

Dundalk Institute of Technology (DkIT) student, Elaine Hughes has been awarded Veterinary Nurse Student of the Year 2016 by the Irish Veterinary Nursing Association (IVNA).

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Financial Report for 8 months to 30 April 2016

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Pay.

Pay is over by €121k for the period, this is a slight increase over last month's variance and the estimate for the full 12 months is still €200k over the budget.

Non-Pay.

Non-Pay has a small negative variance of $\in 2k$ for the year to date. The Non Pay is extremely tight and everything is being done to keep it within the target budget for the year given that the Academic year is nearly over.

Income.

Income for the period to date shows a positive variance.

HEA Grant:

The HEA Grant will be €110k under 2015/2016.

Fees:

Overall fee income shows a negative variance of €241k against the targeted budget in the plan. Further analysis is being carried out to establish the amount of unpaid fees remaining. A fuller picture on fees will be available once the results of exams are due. Income is still coming in on late fees.

Summary

The position at the end of April reflects a similar position to that reported at the end of March. Overspend on Payroll, is still expected to be around \notin 200k and the shortfall on income of \notin 200k (including \notin 110k of Recurrent Grant). The overall position shows \notin 400k over, indicating a net deficit of \notin 733k. (The \notin 750k Devolved Grant, is still not included).

School of Engineering Strategic review

School of Engineering Strategic review for 2016 was noted by the Executive Board on Friday 24th June 2016. It was agreed that following review of the plan by the Executive Board it would be further discussed at the Governing Body.

G.229.7 Update on Research Review from Dr Tim McCormac, Head of Research, DkIT

Dr Tim McCormac presented an update on the recent Research Review. His presentation provided an overview of research activity at the Institute and outlined

cost savings already realised and those planned. Dr McCormac also advised the Board of recently submitted funding applications, which include:

3 Large Scale Interreg applications:

- Netwell/Casala €918,138 (direct) + €229,535 (overhead)
- CREDIT €1,139,120 (direct) + €209,424 (overhead)
- SMRC €1,754,609 + €438,642
- Total Direct €3,811,867 (over 5 years)
- Total Overhead €877,601 (over 5 years)

Interreg proposals are currently being shortlisted and applicants will be advised at the end of June if their projects are included in this shortlist. The final outcome will be announced in early 2017.

Examples of other funding applications include

- SMRC: HRB, IRC and SFI schemes 2016
- Netwell/Casala: H2020 Schemes & SFI, EI, IRC schemes 2016
- CREDIT: SEAI

The Chairman thanked him for his presentation.

G.229.8 AOB

The President advised the Board that the new Irish Language Officer will report to the Vice-President for Strategy, Communications and Development and will work with the Institute's Irish Language Committee. The President confirmed that the Institute has made commitments under the Official Languages Act (Scéim Teanga 2014-2017) but that due to resource constraints is challenged to meet all its commitments. The President has advised Oifig na Gaeilge accordingly and the Irish Language Officer will work with the Coimisinéir Teanga in this regard.

The President agreed to report to the Board in September on Garda Vetting.
