**DkIT's SFF LEARN** programme is an EU-funded initiative designed for students seeking to enhance their entrepreneurial knowledge and skills internationally.

Working in small teams, **SFF LEARN** encourages you to develop a business idea that can help solve real-life problems. Through a series of online workshops, you will learn about business modeling, create a prototype concept and co-learn with students from other parts of Europe.

The programme provides an opportunity to improve those critical **soft skills** that employers are now prioritizing such as **communication**, **creativity**, **time management and teamwork**. You will also develop your ability to **provide peer feedback**, and **practice presentation** and **pitching skills**.





# What can you expect?



**SFF LEARN consists of 5 online sessions.** Student teams will work on, develop, and finally present their business ideas.

Business ideas should address a potential customer problem and plan to offer a corresponding product or service solution, within one of the following **SFF verticals/topics:**

- Manufacturing
- Food
- Energy
- Circular Economy

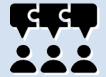

# What's the process?



During the five SFF LEARN training sessions, startup coaches, experts,

**SFF Alumni** and **LEARN staff** from across 20+ European Countries will meet you and help you work on your project ideas.

They will also help you develop a business model, which captures important business components:

- The specific problem your team seeks to solve
- Possible solution(s)
- Your team's product or service offering
- Target market
- Unique selling point

DkIT student teams will also give feedback to European counterpart teams and engage in discussions on the SFF platform.





# X2004X2001 How & Who can apply? X2004X2004

Regardless of which programme you are enrolled on at DkIT, or whether you are an **individual student** (Solo Team) or a **Team** (2-5 students), you can participate in SFF LEARN – provided you want to develop a business idea to solve a specific challenge within one of the SFF verticals (topic areas).

Applicants must apply via the online application form. Following the application deadline, you will receive an email with the SFF platform registration link. Each person must register on the platform in order to be enrolled on the programme and be part of the LEARN community group. It is here that all programme details, events and links to the online sessions will be posted.

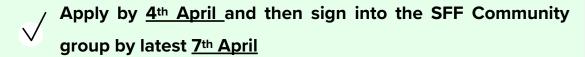


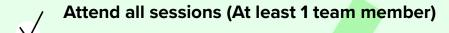


# DO'S & DON'TS

Upload a description of their project idea in the Community

Group by latest 19th April

Search session zoom links in the platform (available under the tab "Events") – there will be no reminder emails

Appreciate that the SFF platform is the primary communication tool in this programme

#### Students are NOT ALLOWED to

Shift or change their session preference once they have submitted their application

Change their vertical (topic area) after application (although their business idea may change during the programme)

Miss the FINAL fifth session (at least 1 team member must be always present).

Application submission is not an automatic platform registration, therefore, all applicants will be required to open their invite link and register on the platform by 7th April.
